MEETING OF THE KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL BOARD OF TRUSTEES

October 7-8, 2022

During the Committee of the Whole on Friday, October 7, 2022, an impromptu board meeting was requested by President Bert West and without objection was called to order at 10:33 a.m. (EDT) in Indianapolis, Indiana, USA and via Zoom Meeting. The purpose of this meeting was to deal with the urgent matter of the recent officer elections by the Philippine South District.

2022 ELECTIONS BY THE PHILIPPINE SOUTH DISTRICT

After the presentation of information and discussion, it was moved and unanimously adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board, acting on its authority in the Kiwanis International Bylaws Article IX, Section 1, to "create, supervise, and control districts of clubs," takes the following actions regarding the Philippine South District:

- 1. Declares the election and appointment of officers at the 2022 district convention null and void.
- 2. Authorizes the Kiwanis International President to appoint a team to review and reorganize the district, including holding new elections.
- 3. Until such time as elections are held and the Kiwanis International Board approves the reorganization, Kiwanis International shall control the district and appoint representatives to assist with district operations.

FORMATION OF KIWANIS CHILDREN'S FUND-EUROPE

That the Kiwanis International Board approves the articles of incorporation and bylaws to create the new entity Kiwanis Children's Fund-Europe, subject to the execution of a license agreement with Kiwanis International.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The report of the 2022-23 Executive Committee, Bert West, Chair, was presented.

RECOMMENDATION FROM THE ORGANIZATIONAL OPERATIONS AND STRUCTURE ASSESSMENT COMMITTEE

Upon recommendation of the Executive Committee, it was moved and adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board directs staff to revise governing documents and training materials to remove the requirement that clubs keep two separate accounts for administrative and service funds. Clubs may still do so, at their discretion, and should comply with laws of local jurisdiction.

This completed the report of the Executive Committee.

REPORT OF THE BOARD COMMITTEE ON RISK MANAGEMENT

The report of the 2022-23 Board Committee on Risk Management, Katrina Baranko, Chair, was presented.

PROCEDURE CHANGES FOR SLP DISTRICT ADMINISTRATORS

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Risk Management it was moved and adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board adopts the revisions to Procedures 220 – District Standing Committees and Key Positions, 127 – Background Check Appeals Committee, and 197 – Criminal History Background Checks, as shown in Exhibit A.

REPORT OF THE BOARD COMMITTEE ON AUDIT AND FINANCE

The report of the 2022-23 Board Committee on Audit and Finance, Michael Mulhaul, Chair, was presented.

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Audit and Finance, it was moved and adopted:

APPROVAL OF THE 2022-23 BUDGET FOR CIRCLE K INTERNATIONAL

That the Kiwanis International Board approves the 2022-23 Budget for Circle K International with an overall deficit of US\$78,846.

PROPOSED DUES ADJUSTMENT AMENDMENT

Upon recommendation of the Audit and Finance Committee, it was moved:

That the Kiwanis International Board revises the dues adjustment amendment proposal previously adopted at the June 8, 2022, Board meeting to read as follows. Only Article XXII, Sections 1 and 2 are changed. Other portions of the original amendment remain the same.

ARTICLE XXII. REVENUE

Section 1. Subject to Sections 2 and 3 of this Article, each club shall pay to Kiwanis International for each member, with the exception of those holding life member status, the <u>following</u> sum <u>of fifty two dollars (US \$52)</u> per annum. Such sum shall be based on each club's annual membership report as of September 30 of each year and shall be due annually on October 1 and payable by November 30. (6/2015) (See also Interpretations.)

- For the administrative year 2023-24: US\$78
- For the administrative year 2024-25: US\$88
- For the administrative year 2025-26 and thereafter: US\$98

Proviso: As of October 1, 2025, these bylaws shall automatically be revised to reflect US\$98 as the annual dues, with no reference to the three-year phase-in period.

Section 2. The Board of Trustees shall adjust the dues from the clubs in any country where the Gross National Income per capita is less than ten thousand dollars (US \$10,000) as reported by the World Bank. The schedule for payment shall be as follows: (6/2015)

- Tier A: Countries with per capita income US \$10,000 or more pay US \$52 shall pay the dues amount stated in Section 1. (6/2015)
- Tier B: Countries with per capita income US \$5,000 to US \$9,999 shall pay: US \$34 US \$60 for the 2023-24 administrative year

US\$70 for the 2024-25 administrative year

US\$80 for the 2025-26 administrative year and thereafter. (6/2015)

• Tier C: Countries with per capita income US \$4,999 or less shall pay: US \$23 US\$49 for the 2023-24 administrative year

US\$59 for the 2024-25 administrative year

US\$69 for the 2025-26 administrative year and thereafter. (6/2015)

Proviso: As of October 1, 2025, these bylaws shall automatically be revised to reflect the final dues amount for Tier B and C, with no reference to the three-year phase-in period.

After debate, the motion was amended and adopted as follows:

That the Kiwanis International Board revises the dues adjustment amendment proposed by the Audit and Finance Committee to read as follows:

XXII. REVENUE

Section 1. Subject to Sections 2 and 3 of this Article, each club shall pay to Kiwanis International for each member, with the exception of those holding life member status, the sum of fifty two dollars (US \$52) eighty-two dollars (US \$82) per annum. Such sum shall be based on each club's annual membership report as of September 30 of each year and shall be due annually on October 1 and payable by November 30. (6/2015) (See also Interpretations.)

Section 2. The Board of Trustees shall adjust the dues from the clubs in any country where the Gross National Income per capita is less than ten thousand dollars (US \$10,000) as reported by the World Bank. The schedule for payment shall be as follows: (6/2015)

- Tier A: Countries with per capita income US \$10,000 or more pay US\$52 shall pay the amount stated in Section 1. (6/2015)
- Tier B: Countries with per capita income US \$5,000 to US \$9,999 shall pay US\$34 US\$54.
- Tier C: Countries with per capita income US \$4,999 or less shall pay US\$23 US\$36.

It was further resolved that elimination of the official publications subscription fee be proposed as a separate amendment from the dues adjustment, with the separate amendment to incorporate a communications fee of US\$6 per member for all clubs in Tier A nations. The Board directs staff to provide wording for such an amendment for review by the Board at its next meeting in January.

REDUCTION IN 2022-23 SPENDING

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Audit and Finance it was moved and adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board requests the Executive Director and staff to reduce spending for 2022-23 by approximately US\$1,000,000 and report progress to the Board by its January 2023 meeting.

FUTURE CONSIDERATION WHEN PREPARING THE 2023-24 BUDGET

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Audit and Finance it was moved:

That the Kiwanis International Board directs staff to identify US\$2,000,000 in reduced spending when preparing the 2023-24 budget. These reductions are based on the 2022-23 budget of US\$3,618,228 deficit approved at the June 2022 board meeting.

The motion was then referred back to committee to clarify its intention.

This completed the report of the Board Committee on Audit and Finance.

FELLOWSHIP GROUPS

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Membership it was moved and adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board approves a pilot program of not more than six shared interest fellowship groups with which to gage the impact on membership retention and value.

KIWANIS ASIA-PACIFIC MATCHING GRANT REQUEST- NEPAL DISTRICT

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Membership it was moved and adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board approves the matching grant request from the Nepal District in the amount of US\$20,000 for growth and education initiatives.

KIWANIS ASIA-PACIFIC MATCHING GRANT REQUEST- JAPAN DISTRICT

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Membership it was moved and adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board approves the matching grant request from the Japan District in the amount of US\$2,150 for Service Club Leadership education initiatives.

KIWANIS ASIA-PACIFIC MATCHING GRANT REQUEST- NEW ZEALAND SOUTH PACIFIC

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Membership it was moved and adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board refers the matching grant request from the New Zealand-South Pacific District back to the district and requests clarity as to the monies being requested.

KIWANIS ASIA-PACIFIC MATCHING GRANT REQUEST- INDIA PROVISIONAL DISTRICT

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Membership it was moved and adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board approves the matching grant request from the India Provisional District in the amount of US\$40,000 for growth purposes.

ASIA-PACIFIC REGION VIRTUAL OFFICE FUNDING REQUEST

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Membership it was moved and adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board approves annual funding in the amount of US\$20,000 in support of the Asia-Pacific region's virtual office.

FLORIDA DISTRICT REQUEST TO ATTACH NEW CLUB IN ST. CROIX

Upon recommendation of the Board Committee on Membership it was moved and adopted:

That the Kiwanis International Board approves the attachment of the pending club in St. Croix, US Virgin Islands, to the Florida District.
