REPORT OF THE GRANTS COMMITTEE

The Report of the 2023-24 Grants Committee, Koji Yoshida, Chair, was presented.

APPROVAL OF CLUB GRANTS

Motion made by the Grants Committee

That the Kiwanis Children's Fund Board approves a total of US\$180,906 for club grants.

• \$25,000 for Kiwanis Club of Lapeer (Michigan): Kiwanis Inclusive Playground, a KCF grant will support the purchase of two fully accessible playground pieces for the playground.

- \$5,940 for Kiwanis Club of Lavanttal (Austria): Creative in die Lehre mit Kunst (Creative Teaching with Art), a KCF grant will support the purchase of art supplies such as paints, brushes, tools, canvas, and ceramics
- \$2,500 for Kiwanis Club of North Shore Long Island (New York): Klothes for Kids, a KCF grant will help the club increase the number of children served to match the project's growing need.
- \$1,000 for Kiwanis Club of Bald Eagle and Nittany Valleys (Pennsylvania): Kiwanis Santa's Workshop, a KCF grant will support the purchase of books and craft supplies.
- \$2,500 for Kiwanis Club of Granada-Meta (Colombia): La Hora Feliz (The Happy Hour), a grant will support the purchase of books, activities, and games for hospitalized children.
- \$3,375 for Kiwanis of Wapakoneta (Ohio): Lifewise Program, a KCF grant will support the purchase of materials such as binders, notebooks, cleaning supplies, and clothing vouchers.
- \$1,000 for Kiwanis Club of the Rising Sun (Eastern Canada and the Caribbean): Fall in Love with Reading, a KCF grant will fund the purchase of electronic reading tablets that will be branded with the club's logo and donated to schools
- \$2,210 for Kiwanis Club of Diamond Bar Professionals (California Nevada Hawaii): Kiwanis STEAM Fair, a KCF grant will cover the costs of free books that will be given to the youth that attend the fair
- \$385 for Kiwanis Club of Greater Portmore (Eastern Canada and the Caribbean): Herbal Gardens in Schools (Ascot High School),, a KCF grant will be used to purchase gardening supplies such as, herbs, soil mix, and gardening tools.
- \$9,800 for Kiwanis Club of Providenciales (Florida): Kiwanis Christmas Tree Lighting, a KCF grant will be used to purchase books for the gift packages.
- \$15,000 for Kiwanis Club of Hilliard (Ohio): Feeding Hilliard Students, a KCF grant will support the purchase of refrigerators that would be located in each school and the club's packing site, as well as additional produce for food packs.
- \$3,000 for Kiwanis Club of 23 Central Surrey (Eastern Canada and the Caribbean): Shady Grove Basic School Improvement, a KCF grant will be used to spray the school for termites, and to fund the implementation of the breakfast feeding program.
- \$3,000 for Kiwanis Club of Siesta Key (Florida): Read Learn Dream Sarasota, a KCF grant will be used to purchase books and materials for up to an additional 70 children
- \$4,800 for Kiwanis Club of Melbourne (Florida): Let's Play! Play Leadership Training Program, a KCF grant will support the development of training videos/manuals and to promote the program.
- \$24,000 for Kiwanis Club of Gig Harbor (Pacific Northwest): Kiwanis Cares for Kids, a KCF grant will help the club meet the increasing demands for clothing and shoes.
- \$1,296 for Kiwanis of Opelousas (Louisiana-Mississippi-W. Tennessee): Kiwanis Kids, a KCF grant will support the purchase of gift cards given to students who are entered into the drawing at the end of the grading period
- \$1,500 for Kiwanis Club of Fostoria (Ohio): Fostoria Kiwanis Shoe Program, a KCF grant will help the club meet the increased need for shoes, socks and bookbags
- \$6,200 for Kiwanis Club of Richmond (Capital): Book Bridge Initiative, a KCF grant will support the purchase of books for book fairs and classroom libraries
- \$2,400 for Kiwanis of the Rockaways (New York): Swim Lessons for Local Youth, a KCF grant will support marketing initiatives for the project and provide essential items for care packages
- \$2,100 for Kiwanis Club of Hickory (Carolinas): Dictionaries for Third Grade Students, a KCF grant will support the purchase of about 550 dictionaries
- \$7,000 for Kiwanis Club of Shan Hsin (Taiwan): After school tutoring classes of Wu-Liao Elementary School, a KCF grant will support rental expenses for the van, school supplies and food for the program
- \$4,000 for Kiwanis Club of Park Ridge (Illinois-Eastern Iowa): Mental Health Care Kit, a KCF grant will be used to purchase supplies for the mental health kit
- \$6,000 for Kiwanis Club of Petersburg (Capital): Kiwanis Holiday Toy and Coat Drive, a KCF grant will support the purchase of 200 coats

- \$4,400 for Kiwanis Club of Lauderdale Lakes (Florida): Lauderdale Lakes Reading Oasis, a
 KCF grant will be used to support the purchase of bookshelves, books and seating for three
 Reading Oasis
- \$4,000 for Kiwanis Club of Craiova (Romania): CleanUP Community, a KCF grant will be used to support the development of education materials for the project, supplies for the activities and leadership development opportunities for the students engaged in the project
- \$1,000 for Kiwanis Club of Brigham City (Utah Idaho): Stuff the Bus, a KCF grant will support the purchase of school supplies and 100 backpacks
- \$2,000 for Kiwanis Club of Sycamore (Illinois Eastern Iowa): Playground Musical Instrument Pilot Project, a KCF grant will support the purchase of equipment as well as installation costs
- \$15,000 for Kiwanis Club of Sierra Vista-San Pedro (Southwest): Stocking Stuffers, a KCF grant will help cover the increasing costs, ensuring the project can continue and serve up to 650 children
- \$1,500 for Kiwanis Club of Lenape Valley (New Jersey): Clothe-a-Child, a KCF grant will be used to purchase 50 additional coats for the project
- \$4,000 for Kiwanis Club of Hagerstown (Capital): Kiwanis Cares, a KCF grant will be used to purchase hygiene and clothing items for boxes tailored to each school's needs.
- \$5,000 for Kiwanis Club of Bethesda (Capital): Miracle League of Montgomery County Training and Recruitment Project, a KCF grant will help fund the production of the training and recruiting videos, as well as incidental marketing expenses
- \$10,000 for Kiwanis Club of East Lansing (Michigan): Book Vending Machines, a KCF grant will support the purchase of two book vending machines and books
