### **Recommendation #1**

Approval of club grant

### **Background:**

The Kiwanis Club of Chuquiragua-Quito, Ecuador, has offered scholarships for the last three years of study at fifteen schools in the city of Quito. The club recognizes that the education of women has a multiplier effect, including a lowered risk of teen pregnancy and better job prospects if they assume the leadership of a single parent household.

The scholarship is awarded to first-year high school students and is generally renewed for two more years, until graduation. As a complement to the monetary contribution, the club will hold several workshops for the recipients and their parents that cover topics such as self-esteem, leadership, communication, prevention of drug and alcohol use, etc. In September 2022, the club received a \$2,000 grant to support the next cohort of students. Half of this went toward uniforms and school supplies for each of the five students, the other half covered the workshop offerings for all active cohorts. Since each cohort is supported for three years, the club asked if they would be eligible to apply in the future; \$2,000 in 2023 and \$1,000 in 2024 to support each year of the current cohort.

Although KCF did not guarantee funding, staff did say that if they submitted a final report, they could be considered. This was before the Grants Committee instated the requirement that clubs must wait two years after submitting the final report for their most recent grant before applying for a new grant. The Grants Committee approved the second round of funding (\$1,000) in 2023. The club has submitted the report for the most recent payment and requests the final grant of \$1,000.

### **Discussion:**

The committee discussed whether or not to fund this grant and determined that the current 2-year waiting period to apply for a new club grant does not apply to this club because its original application was received before this policy. Also, because this final grant concludes the Kiwanis Children's Fund commitment to support the club's project, the committee unanimously approved the grant.
